**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF SANCREED PARISH COUNCIL HELD AT MARY WILLIAMS HALL, SANCREED, ON 19<sup>TH</sup> MARCH 2019 AT 7.30PM**

**COUNCILLORS PRESENT**

Councillors Mr Ian Soulsby (Chairman), Mr Stuart Thomas, Mrs Hilary Harris, Mr Michael Harvey, Mr Robert Eddy, Mr David Haigh, Mr Ivor James and Mr Tommy James.

**ALSO PRESENT**

Councillor Mrs Helen Hawkins, Mrs Alexis Male (clerk) and one member of the public.

**19-113. APOLOGIES**

Apologies were accepted from Councillors Mr James Maddern.

**19-114. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

There were no declarations of interest.

**19-115. PUBLIC SPEAKING**

- A suggestion was made that, in memory of the late Councillor Bill Maddern, a seat could be placed on the Beacon or in Tony's Woods.
- A question was asked about who had the responsibility for the health and safety of people in the parish and the Chairman suggested that they get in touch with Cornwall Council.
- Councillor Mrs Hawkins let councillors know that she had been invited to a meeting on the consultation re the work on the A3071.

**19-116. POLICE**

- No crimes had been reported in January.
- Councillor Mrs Harris reported that she had undergone the training for Community Speedwatch. Three sites with the highest priority would be targeted. There was a backlog of sites to receive the service and those about which the most complaints had been received would be tackled at first.
- Councillor Mrs Harris also informed councillors that she had spoken with Steve Bayley (Cormac) at the recent Highways Scheme meeting who had told her that Cornwall Council's policy on vehicle activated signs (VAS) had changed and a parish could purchase them, or a number of parishes between them, and they could be moved around on a rota system. It was suggested that this matter be brought to the council for discussion with costs.

**19-117. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING**

The minutes of the meeting held on 19<sup>th</sup> February 2019 having been previously circulated, it was resolved that they were a true and correct record and were signed.

**19-118. MEMORIAL FOR COUNCILLOR BILL MADDERN**

It was reported that Bill Maddern's daughter in law had been shocked to hear that the Parish Council were considering placing something on The Glebe, thinking that it should be in Newbridge village, perhaps by the bench that was already there. Some councillors also felt that it should be in Newbridge and the Chairman informed members that the seat on The Glebe was sound. A suggestion was made that an advertisement for ideas could be made but the Chairman said that that had been unsuccessful on other occasions. Other ideas of installing a seat by the noticeboard, upgrading the seat to granite and asking the family where in the village would be a good idea were mooted. It was agreed that the Chairman would speak to Councillor James Maddern about this matter.

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**19-119. VACANCY**

Councillors were informed that no applications had been received so it was agreed to advertise again and place the matter on the agenda of the June meeting.

**19-120. FOOTPATHS AND HIGHWAYS**

- The Chairman informed members that he had contacted West Cornwall Footpath Preservation Society which was responsible for replacing the way marker at Trevorrian. He had been told that the society had been authorised to replace broken signs and, once they had completed that work, the society would turn to installing signs that had never been put up originally. The Chairman felt that Cormac should have informed the Parish Council that this authority had been given to the society and, also, that the clerk had misled the councillors about this sort of work not being carried out at present.
- Two tenders had been received for the cutting of footpaths under the LMP scheme and The Glebe. It was agreed to accept that from Pip Morse.

**19-121. PLANNING**

- **Applications**
  - No planning applications had been received.
- **Decisions**
  - PA18/09585 – Mrs Jean Buckland - Listed Building Consent for renovation of the farmhouse at Trenuggo, Access Track To Trenuggo, St Buryan. Approved with conditions.

**19-122. FINANCE**

- Payments of £315.16 were agreed for payment.

**19-123. EXTERNAL REPORTS AND CORRESPONDENCE**

- West Penwith Community Network Panel, Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> March 2019 – Councillors T James, Mrs H Harris and S Thomas would try to attend the meeting.
- Meet the Planners, Monday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2019 – The Chairman had attended this meeting and felt that it had been well presented. The new arrangements had been explained with eight areas, each having a central team of planning staff.
- Network Panels Highways Scheme Meeting with Mike Peters, Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> February 2019 – Councillor Mrs Harris had attended and reported that it was one step closer to choosing the schemes that would benefit from the funding.
